
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

# TRUMP APPROVAL RATING AT 52% IN ALABAMA MAJORITY ALSO APPROVE OF IVEY & SHELBY JOB PERFORMANCE


Most state voters approve of the job President Donald Trump is doing as president. Statewide, 52% say they approve of Trump's performance, while 44% disapprove and just 4% are not sure.



Governor Kay Ivey draws the strongest job approval rating in Alabama. Statewide, 60% approve of Ivey's performance, while 28% disapprove and 12% are not sure.



A majority also approves of the way veteran Senator Richard Shelby is handling his job. Statewide, 52% approve of Shelby's performance, while 35% disapprove and 13% are undecided.



Support patterns are relatively consistent among these three GOP elected officials. Their strongest approval ratings come for those who identify themselves as Republicans, men, whites and older voters.

Their ratings are generally lower among Democrats, women, African-American voters and younger voters. However, the degree of support and opposition among these sub-groups vary. Trump only receives a 4% approval rating from Democrats, while Shelby gets 29% and Ivey's approval is at 41%.

Trump's support among Republicans is 87%, compared to Ivey's at 75% and Shelby at 65%. Overall, Trump approval/disapproval is a sharp divide, while Ivey draws significant cross-over support. Shelby sits in the middle, less supported by Republicans than Trump or Ivey, but far more popular among traditional Democratic voter groups than Trump.

### **HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED**

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from April 9 through April 11, 2019. A total of 625 registered Alabama voters were interviewed statewide by telephone.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Alabama voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than ± 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.
